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DotHouse Health Physician Awarded Grant to Decrease Substance Abuse in Dorchester

DotHouse Health Adult Medicine physician Rachel King, MD, was awarded a special projects grant from the Massachusetts League of Community Health Centers. This grant project aims to decrease substance abuse in our community and improve physician awareness around substance abuse issues.

Dr. Rachel King explains, "My interest in addiction medicine began during my residency at Boston Medical Center, where I observed firsthand the devastation that addiction may bring to individuals, families, and communities. Through mentorship, I began to learn more about medication-assisted treatment for patients with opioid addiction, and soon recognized that treatment of patients with addictions would become an integral part of my career."

The project will aide in early identification and intervention for patients with unhealthy substance use through enhanced screening. Grant money will also help improve the treatment and monitoring of patients with active addictions, as well as the development of additional resources and education for physicians managing patients who are prescribed controlled substances.

According to a Substance Abuse in Boston report in 2011 from the Boston Public Health Commission, Dorchester had a higher rate of treatment admissions for substance abuse and higher rate of overdose deaths compared to the Boston average. This project will bring needed medical attention to this issue.
